REPUBLICANS WORK TO LOWER GAS PRICES

After two consecutive years of fuel prices surpassing the \$5 per gallon mark in communities across Arizona, Republican lawmakers are working to ease the financial burden hitting hardworking Arizonans when they fill their gas tanks. We hosted a press conference this week announcing our plan to prevent out-of-control price hikes at the pump. I'll be introducing legislation in 2024 addressing the fuel blend requirements in Maricopa County responsible for sending prices soaring during supply disruptions. The bill will create a free market solution by allowing retailers to offer a total of eight fuel blends, all with similar clean air benefits, as opposed to just two. Our working-class citizens are struggling in this economy. Turning a blind eye to crippling gas prices is like throwing salt on their wounds. As lawmakers, we should do everything in our power to improve the lives of our citizens who elected us to represent them.

BIDEN MUST IMMEDIATELY ACT ON BORDER CRISIS

COLORADO RIVER WATER NEGOTIATIONS

I joined hundreds of people from across the seven basin states who have a stake in the future of the Colorado River water supply at the Colorado River Water Users Association conference this week. Solutions were discussed for the seven states, including Arizona, that rely on water supplied from the Colorado River based on recent studies and current proposal. It's critical that we have conferences like this where discussion, collaboration and solutions can be forged. Historically, Arizona has been a leader in creative solutions and conservation measures that have helped support the Colorado River supplies in the lower basin states. Arizona is also unique in that our statute requires the legislature to bless any final agreement entered into by the state with the other Basin States and the federal government. In addition to being a part of these important conversations, I look forward to bringing forth new legislation in the upcoming session to focus on our most precious resource. *-Senator Sine Kerr*
